Client-Focused Brochure	 Elizabeth shared the first draft of a new day program brochure that is written for clients The brochure answers frequently asked questions about topics such as meals, transportation, daily activities, and the benefits of attending The Club Doug inquired about having contact information in the brochure - concerns around clients obtaining phone numbers/emails and then calling to cancel 	Required
McCormick Mobile Update from Tara	 McCormick Mobile (in-home caregiver education project) is currently in its second phase thanks to a grant from the Petro Canada CareMakers grant This phase, which started in May 2025 and will run until March/April 2026, will support 46 families. 29 of these will have completed the education before Christmas McCormick Mobile is a research project that is developed in collaboration with Western University The preliminary feedback shows positive changes in the following areas: emotional change, communication, relationship quality, responsive behaviours, meaningful activities, knowledge and confidence, and self care The next phase of McCormick Mobile will be funded by the Alzheimer Society The ultimate goal is to offer McCormick Mobile as an ongoing initiative, without the research component 	
Budget Forecasting 2026/27	 The current fiscal year deficits have led to fee increases, service cuts, and staff layoffs. November 29th is the last day for the afternoon program (2:30-8:00pm) Reducing respite to 6 nights/week has been proposed to balance the upcoming balance Becky has submitted three expressions of interest for additional funding from Ontario Health: to keep overnight respite at 7 nights/week, to maintain current day program capacity, and to fund McCormick Mobile Responses to these will be delivered in January Council discussed utilizing Western University and Fanshawe College students to assist with marketing Council also discussed the future of AI and the ways that it is currently being used to save costs in other fields 	

Grant Application Updates	 Elizabeth has facilitated two sessions of the photobook project that is being funded by the Senior's Community Grant This year, McCormick Dementia Services is asking for funding to hire a temporary educator position. This individual would work in a temporary contact for 2 days/week and assist with the "behind the scenes" that goes into the education programs offered at McCormick Council also suggested the Ontario Trillium Foundation 	
Annual Survey Results	 The preliminary results of the 2025 Client and Care Partner Annual Satisfaction Survey were shared with council 80 of 170 survey were returned – challenging year as the Canada Post strike impacted the ability for pre-paid envelopes to be included with the survey New question asking for age demographics was included, as well as questions about meal satisfaction and assessing interest in McCormick hosting activities for clients and care partners to participate in together The official results will be shared with all clients and care partners in the coming weeks 	
Financial Agreement	 Council was given a copy of the new financial agreement to review New agreement more clearly outlines the costs for all services, describes the refund policy (which was a CARF recommendation), and outlines the late pick-up policy
